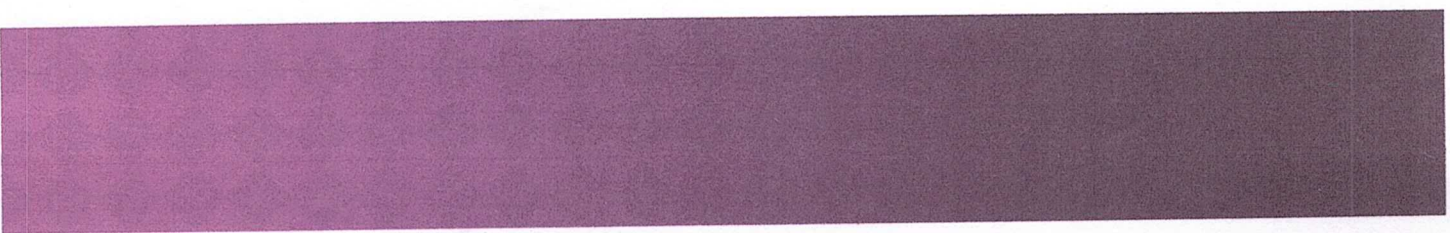

**Тип урока:** комбинированный

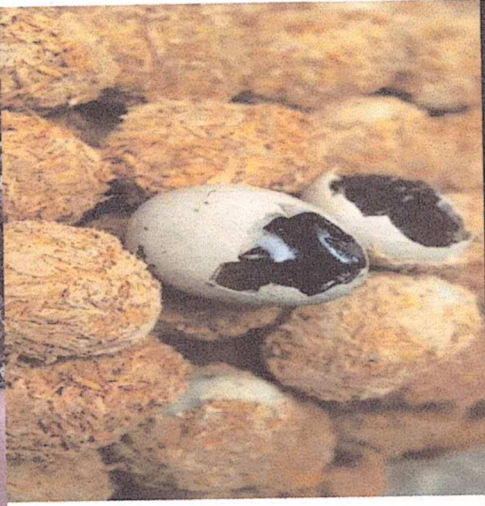
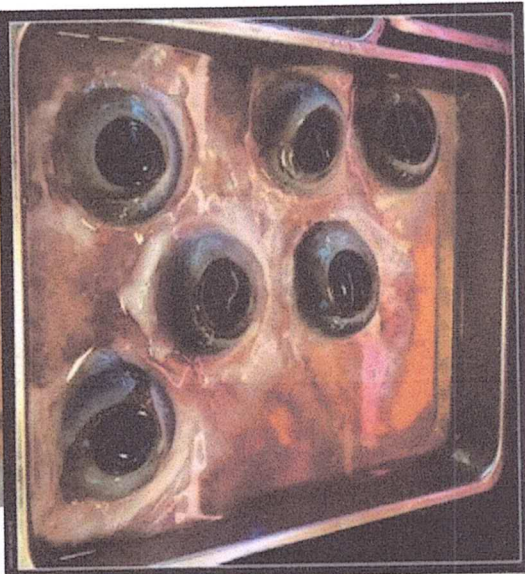

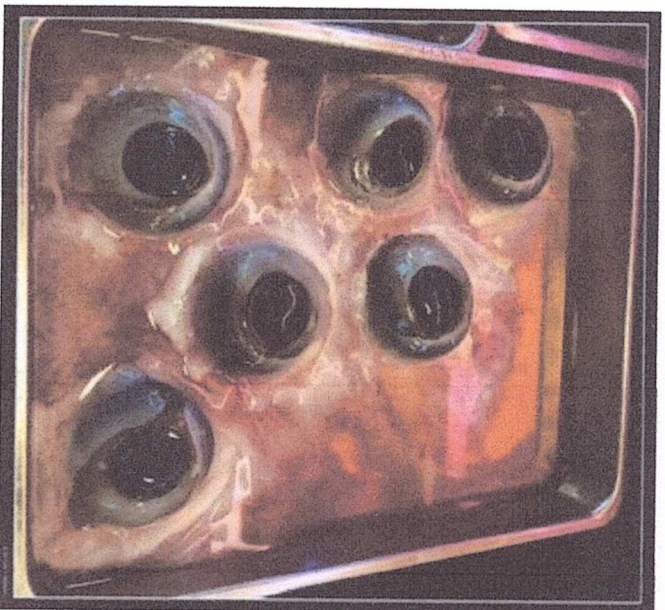
Before reading the text p. 153 ex. 1b try to answer the following questions:

One of the most amazing things about travelling is trying really interesting foods from around the world. The cuisines in different countries **vary** a lot, and if some food may **turn your nose up**, other people might find it delicious. It's not surprising because different cultures have different customs and taste preferences. If you are ready to explore some foods which might be really unusual, let's do it now. If you don't have a fear of spiders, try **crispy** tarantulas, a delicious **delicacy** in Cambodia. You will detect the taste of crab if you don't pay attention to the fact that a giant spider is hanging from your mouth, of course. Do you know what happens to an egg if you keep it for 100 years? It definitely becomes **rotten**. But it will also become a delicacy that you can try in China. Of course, nowadays, if you want to try it, you don't have to wait 100 years before it's ready. They cook it for a few months in a special **mixture**. You may try it if you are not very sensitive to strong smells. The USA is also home to some unusual cuisines, and among them is a fried brain sandwich. If you go to Illinois, you will find this dish in some **local** restaurants. Some people who have tried it say that it's really delicious! What would you say?
